Mr. Matt Haley's Industrial Technology high school class visited Wheat Belt headquarters on Monday, September 28th. The students

were required to write a minimum of five facts learned during the 60-minute presentation.

A wall size map of our territory was shown along with some of the different equipment found on an electric utility pole, equipment used by linemen, what wet sand looks like after touched by an energized power line, and, a live, low-voltage demonstration.

Our outage process was discussed and a "License to Live" video by Safe Electricity was shown. The video focused on what to do if you are ever in an accident that involves a utility pole or underground equipment.

Electric Vehicles

Electric vehicles have been making the news recently, especially with California announcing that all new vehicles sold in that state after 2035 will need to be powered by electricity. Electric vehicles are not new, in fact some of the very first automobiles were powered by batteries. What has changed is the battery technology, charging times, and economics. Today's electric vehicles appear to be as reliable and more cost effective as compared to a traditional gasoline powered car.

The small and toylike vehicles of the past are not the norm today. Ford has announced their all electric F150 for late next year, Tesla cars are sporty, and there are more practical versions already out or in the works. There are two types of plug-in electric vehicles. A fully electric version and a plug-in hybrid version, known as a PHEV. Chrysler Pacifica PHEV to our fleet through a lease. This plug-in hybrid will be our long term test vehicle, performing a majority of its tasks on full electric power, but having the engine available for longer trips. I also purchased a PHEV personally and have been collecting data from my commuting and other trips. Over the coming months we will provide what we learned, our experiences, and the data on efficiency and cost. We will use our data to develop optimum retail rates for charging the vehicles, so that you can get the most economical benefit, should you make the switch. We plan to compare the different driving styles and needs to gain a greater understanding and confidence in these vehicles. If you consider an electric vehicle for yourself, we hope we can be a resource for you.

So far our experience has been positive, but time and testing will ensure the best possible opinion.
